2010 Guidelines for the Educational Development Fee

Like Filipino students, foreign students of the University of the Philippines are subsidized by Filipino taxpayers. In April 1988, the Board of Regents approved the imposition of the Education Development Fee, which foreign students pay in addition to matriculation fees effective June 1988. The act was premised on the conviction that foreign students should contribute more toward the cost of their own education.

Guidelines were approved for the new fee, which were subsequently elaborated and revised in July 1988 by the Office of the Chancellor, in February 1989 by Memorandum No. 5 issued by the Office of the President, in February 1990 by then Chancellor Jose P. Abueva, and in May 1990 also by Chancellor Abueva.

The 2010 Guidelines integrates and updates all previous guidelines, including those for granting discounts. In addition, a new application form for discounts is prescribed. This form requires information that shall be used as basis for evaluating the request. See Attached form for request for EDF discount.

The EDF collection is returned in full to the academic unit.
