## Guide for Writing An Autobiography

- 1. The autobiography must be a brief and concise narrative of the student's life history, focusing on significant events and concerns (e.g. positive and negative experiences, relationships, turning points, strengths and weaknesses), particularly those that
- a) May have had a bearing on his/her choice of social work as an academic discipline and future profession;
- b) May positively or negatively affect his/her performance in Field Instruction (e.g., shyness to initiate a conversation with clients; middle class lifestyle might hinder ability to live and work with people in an urban/rural poor community); personal apprehensions in engaging individuals, groups and communities in the social work helping process like communication barriers, etc.)
- 2. Include your reflections on the following:
- a) As future social workers, who will work with individuals, groups, families and communities and who will be in touch with various realities in the field, what are the knowledge, skills, attitudes and general competencies that you think you will need to enhance?
- b) What support will you need from your faculty and agency supervisors?
