(B. S. C. D.)I. Introduction

The B.S.C.D. curriculum is a four-year professional degree program designed to provide students with knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary for working effectively with people in various community settings. It is consistent with the recently developed philosophy of the Institute of Social Work and Community Development, which states that "The ISWCD is committed to the philosophy that man in general and Filipinos in particular must live in a just society. It will strive to work towards the creation of a society that meets all of men's basic needs by ensuring equal access to opportunities and benefits through people's participation in building cultural, economic, political and social institutions so that each man may effectively contribute to the realization of his own and other men's full potential."

A total of 141 units are required for graduation broken down as follows: 63 units in the General Education Program, 54 units of core CD courses, 15 units of CD electives and 9 units of electives.

The first two years of college, consistent with the General Education Program, are aimed at equipping the student with general background knowledge. The first semester third year courses are geared towards giving the would-be community workers a firm grasp of the setting in which they will work as well as an introduction to the theoretical frameworks that serve as the basis for development programs. The second semester third year courses revolve around development programs and strategies. At the same time the students will get their first exposure to field work. This will immediately be followed up during the summer session with a more intensive field exposure.

The first semester fourth year courses emphasize skills that a CD worker needs: research, planning and administration. The final semester is a summing up of the CD courses. The Special Problems course will afford the students the chance to focus on any aspect of CD in

in which they feel the need for more training while CD 171 will deal with ethics, responsibility and commitment.

Starting from the second semester of third year, each student may choose from several elective courses. This will serve two purposes: to get a broader view of the discipline and to be able to focus on sub-fields of specialization as for example taking Advanced Research, Practicum III, etc.
